Swedish Election Study 2002

The following questions asked, and identically worded, both in Phase A and Phase B (pre- and post-election surveys, respectively):

1-4, 6, 9, 11-20, 22, 24, 25, 27-33, 34FA, 37, 39, 41, 65-67, 69-78

The following questions only asked in Phase A (pre-election survey):

5, 7, 8, 11, 21, 23, 26C, 36

The following questions only asked in Phase B (post-election survey):

34C-34I, 34G, 38B, 40, 42-64 (Q. 46-64 are the CSES questions), 68.

The following questions appear in both phases, but with some wording variations (for example that the tense has been changed to accommodate the fact that the election has been held):

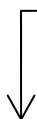

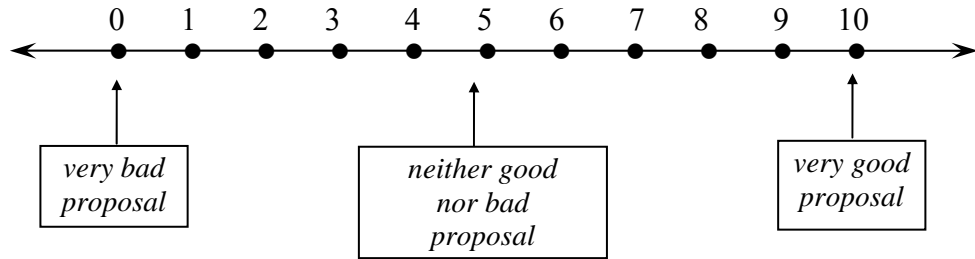

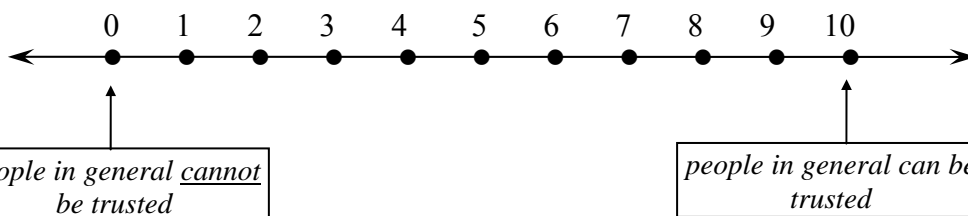

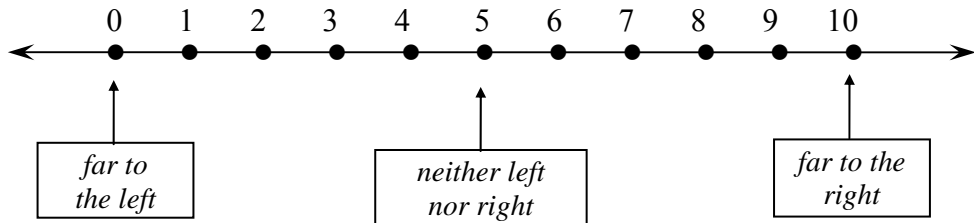

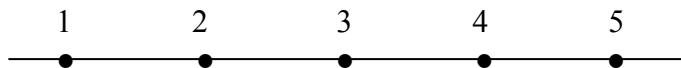

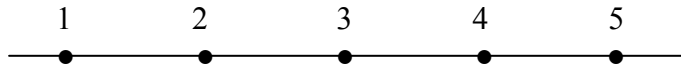


R's position regarding whether it makes a difference who is in power

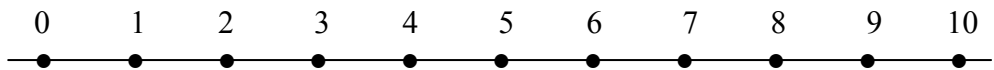

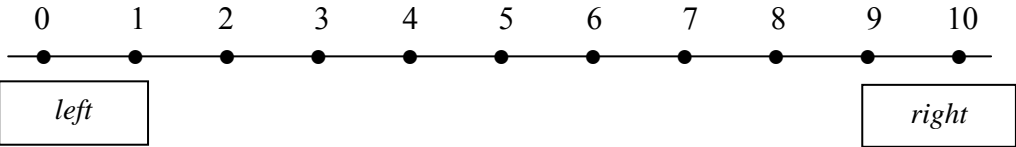
